# what organization you will **JOIN**

Communities In Schools of Chicago is a dropout prevention organization that works. Our mission is to surround students with a community of support, helping them to stay in school and achieve in life. In 2019-20, our organization will help empower 75,000 Chicago public-school students to **stay on the path to graduation**.

Our organization accomplishes this goal through two core programs:

- the Partnership Program, which links a variety of essential support programs, provided by a network of community partners, to schools across the city,
- And the Intensive Program, which places a master's level staff member, or Student Supports Manager, on-the-ground in 31 schools.

Interns will work specifically with a designated Student Supports Manager – and school – in our Intensive Program, helping provide targeted, case-managed support to students at risk of failure or dropout.

# the intensive program

Open to graduate students interested in working with children and adolescents in a school setting, the Intensive Program Internship falls under the school-based team at Communities In Schools of Chicago and takes place over the course of an entire academic year (September — May/June).

Individuals pursuing advanced degrees in psychology, social work, counseling, expressive therapies, or a related field are encouraged to apply.

# what you will LEARN

Interns will gain experience using a model of Integrated Student Supports to help students stay successful in school.

Our students are referred to our services for a variety of reasons, including a change in key school success indicators (attendance, behavior, course performance), grief/loss issues, mental health issues, and/or student leadership opportunities.

# what you will

Interns will:

- Learn to conduct initial assessments (Strengths & Risks, Social-Emotional Academic Development, Questionnaire on Self-Regulation, Developmental Relationships);
- Run individual and group sessions with a focus on social-emotional learning;
- Maintain accurate student files;
- Stay current with service data entries (using SIRP notes); and
- Participate on various teams in the school setting, as assigned (for example, a Behavior Health Team or a Culture/Climate Team).

#### did you KNOW

- Communities In Schools of Chicago is partnering with 175 of the city's public schools during the 2019-20 academic year.
- In 2018-2019, 967 targeted students in grades K-12 received intensive case management and counseling from our Student Supports Managers.
- Of those students, nearly 59 percent were either promoted or graduated. NONE dropped out.
